Arrival dates: Strawberries, Asparagus & Rhubarb: early May. Sweet Potato Slips: end of May. All live plants are tender, particularly Sweet Potatoes, and should be picked up as soon as possible. We will contact you when they arrive!

Pick up agreement: All Orders must be picked up by May 31, 2025. Orders left after this date will be considered abandoned and eligible for re-sale. There are no refunds for unclaimed orders. Curbside pickup will be available for all orders; please call to schedule if you prefer this option. ASPARAGUS CROWNS A perennial plant that arrives as bare roots – performs best when the planting site is prepared well in advance. Prefers a soil pH of 7.0-7.2. Do not harvest the first year!

Millenium. A cold-hardy asparagus that maintains tip tightness as it grows. Millennium is well-adapted to various soil types, including heavier soils. Rust Tolerant.

STRAWBERRIES, BARE-ROOT CROWNS Leaves, roots, runners and fruit all develop from the crown. Plant as soon as possible in the spring after the soil has reached 50° F. All flower buds should be pinched off June-bearing plants in the first year to encourage runner production and support growth. Fruit from everbearing plants may be harvested in the first season – just pinch off the first flush of flowers 3-4 weeks after setting plants.

Sparkle. June-bearing. Heirloom quality medium red fruits with excellent flavor. **Seascape.** Everbearing. Large, firm fruit with good flavor when picked ripe! Excellent Summer and Fall production.

RHUBARB CROWNS Require well drained soil. Do not harvest the first year. Subsequent years, rhubarb is typically harvested from early May to early June.

Victoria. Large, tender rosy-red stalks that gradually turn to pink and then solid green toward the tip. Sweeter and milder than other varieties.

SWEET POTATO SLIPS Arrive as bare root pieces. They may be dry, wilted, pale or brown in color – this is normal. They may or may not have visible roots. This does not negatively impact viability or yield. Plant as soon as possible when the soil temp is at least 60° F. If not planting immediately, wrap the root end of the slips in moist paper towels, keeping the leaves and stems dry out of direct sunlight and wind.

Covington. Widely adapted traditional orange sweet potato, Covington has copper and rose-colored skin with sweet, smooth, bright orange flesh.
