STRAWBERRIES, BARE-ROOT CROWNS Leaves, roots, runners and fruit all develop from the crown. Plant as soon as possible in the spring after the soil has reached 50° F. All flower buds should be pinched off June-bearing plants in the first year to encourage runner production and support growth. Fruit from everbearing plants may be harvested in the first season – just pinch off the first flush of flowers 3-4 weeks after setting plants. Plant 12-18” apart, 3-4’ between rows.

Annapolis. June-bearing, early-season. Produces high-quality, medium-large fruit with a mild, sweet flavor, making this variety a first-rate choice for northern areas. Annapolis is vigorous and produces many runners. This variety is very winter hardy and has shown some resistance to red stele and foliar diseases.

Jewel. June-bearing, mid-season. Boasts intensely sweet large berries with superior quality and appearance. Jewel performs well in a wide range of growing conditions and is manageable for growers of all sizes.

AC Valley Sunset. June-bearing, late-season. Berries are light red, shiny, and large-sized with very good flavor and yield. Plants are vigorous with no apparent foliage disease concerns. Great for extending the June picking season!

Evie-2. Everbearing. Easy to grow and higher yielding than most day-neutrals. This variety is less sensitive to the warm summer temperatures that can shut down day-neutral production. Berries have an attractive red color, good flavor, and maintain their size throughout the season.

RHUBARB CROWNS Require well drained soil. Do not harvest the first year.

Subsequent years, rhubarb is typically harvested from early May to early June. Plant 3’ between plants, 6’ between rows.

MacDonald. This very vigorous, upright-growing strain produces large, tender stalks and has good red color. Shows resistance to root-rot.

HORSERADISH Thrives in full sun, will tolerate light shade. Set roots in early spring in furrows 3-5” deep 1-2” below the soil surface.

Big Top. Excellent size, vigor, and widely adaptable. A few roots will last a lifetime! An added plus is resistance to foliage diseases, rust, and bacterial spot—all potentially common horseradish problems.

ASPARAGUS CROWNS A perennial plant that arrives as bare roots – performs best when the planting site is prepared well in advance. Prefers a soil pH of 7.0-7.2. Do not harvest the first year! Plant 4-6” deep, 12-18” apart, 3-6’ between rows.

Mary Washington. An easy-to-grow heirloom variety with excellent flavor and quality. This vigorous, rust-resistant, winter-hardy variety produces large, rich green stalks.

Purple Passion. Purple Passion is a unique variety – its purple color, flavor, and tenderness is a delight. Plant 6-8” apart instead of the usual 12”.

We encourage you to order early; pre-payment in full is required to place and secure an order. Payments made with cash or check receive a 3% discount. Quantities are limited, and orders will be filled on a first come/first served basis.

Arrival dates: April to early May. All live plants are tender and should be picked up as soon as possible. We will contact you when they arrive!

Pick up agreement: All Orders must be picked up by May 23, 2026. Orders left after this date will be considered abandoned and eligible for re-sale. There are no refunds for unclaimed orders. Curbside pickup will be available for all orders; please call to schedule if you prefer this option.
